## History

Century II began as a project of the Baptist Men in 1980. It is a program where individuals can pledge support for new initiatives with CBWC churches. Churches wanting to make renovations or upgrades to their facilities can apply to their Regional Minister, who takes recommendations forward to the CBWC's Executive Staff.

Each Century II participant promises to give a minimum of \$20 to each project (up to 4 times a year). 90% of each donation goes to the project, while 10% is used to help cover communication and receipting costs. **To account for inflation over 30 years, please consider increasing your gift above the original \$20, if possible.**

Southwest Community Church has been in existence for over 50 years. In addition to hosting Sunday services, special seasonal services, Empty Nesters potlucks, youth events, Soup Sundays, and other various Bible studies, prayer meetings, et cetera, the building Southwest Community Church calls home is very active year-round with an array of community users.

Currently, they host two Montessori programs, a Fun Fit Club, Desert Harmony Choir, Girl Guides, a quilt-making guild, painting classes (with a local artist), as well as professional development retreats and dinners for local Christian and secular organizations. As Pastor Shane Wiebe says, "Our space is constantly in use and we are very grateful for that!"

Southwest will also be hosting SERVE, CBWC's annual youth mission trip and conference, in 2018. Pastor Shane is thrilled about the opportunity.

"We're very excited to have the privilege of hosting this marvellous event and have begun preparations to make it meaningful for every guest, participant, recipient, and volunteer," says Shane.

"In fact, we are equally excited about the impact SERVE will have in our community and how it will help us build relationships with those in our city."

## The Need

The Southwest facility has two major issues that need to be addressed: the first issue is a failing AC compressor and the second is a hot water tank that needs to be replaced and converted to natural gas.

Because of the extreme nature of Kamloops' weather, Shane says, "we need both of these things running well for us to make SERVE and our continued ministry here in Kamloops a success."

The entire project has been quoted at \$10,500.
