## History

Century II began as a project of the Baptist Men in 1980. It is a program where individuals can pledge support for new initiatives with CBWC churches. Churches wanting to make renovations or upgrades to their facilities can apply to their Regional Minister, who takes recommendations forward to the CBWC's Executive Staff.

Each Century II participant promises to give a minimum of \$20 to each project (up to 4 times a year). 90% of each donation goes to the project, while 10% is used to help cover communication and receipting costs. **To account for inflation over 30 years, please consider increasing your gift above the original \$20, if possible.**

## Summer Appeal: Qualicum Community Baptist Church



Qualicum Baptist is a thriving church with a weekly attendance of approximately 55. Situated in the Oceanside area of Vancouver Island, they seek to share the love of Christ with all those He brings into their care.

The community of Qualicum Beach has the oldest average-aged population in Canada, which the church leadership believes is a great opportunity.

As Senior Pastor Allan Walker says, "For some it is their last mile and we are blessed to be a part of that portion of their journey. For others it is offering up gifts of time and strength to help those who are in limited supply. For all of us at Qualicum Community Baptist Church, it is being the body of Christ in every way imaginable."

The church facility is a heritage building and serves the whole community, housing a Monday-Friday preschool, several self-help groups such as Alcoholics Anonymous and Narcotics Anonymous as well as other community groups like the Weavers and Spinners and the Oceanside Jammers (a group of fiddlers playing traditional Celtic music).

## The Need

The building's roof, which was installed in 1994, has now reached the end of its useful life. Late last winter, congregants arrived at the facility on a Sunday morning to find water streaming down one of the walls in the sanctuary. They temporarily replaced enough shakes at the edge of the roof to stop the deluge. However, an inspection showed that the roof is beyond repair and must be replaced before winter when the rainy season returns.

The roof replacement will cost \$30,000, with the cost being shared with the town, so the church expects to be responsible for at least \$15,000. Will you partner with Qualicum as they continue to serve the Lord in their community?
