Dr. Wil Rogan

Wil Rogan is assistant professor of biblical studies at Carey Theological College. He earned his PhD in New Testament from Fuller Theological Seminary, and has articles published in New Testament Studies, Currents in Biblical Research, and Journal of Theological Interpretation, as well as a book forthcoming with T&T Clark. Before working in theological education, he served in various pastoral roles at Grace Long Beach for a decade. Wil finds joy in helping people read Scripture closely, because one never knows what will happen when it's done. He resides with his wife, two young sons, and three cats in Los Angeles, and enjoys surfing, playing guitar, and thoughtful conversation.

Retreat Theme:

Jesus, Where Are You Staying?

Through the stories of those who met Jesus—Nathanael, the Samaritan Woman, the Man Born Blind, and Mary—we'll reflect on how Jesus meets us, calls us into service, challenges us in his physical absence, and enables us to recognize his presence. In the retreat sessions, expect a blend of attention to the Gospel of John and attention to our own lives with Jesus. In so doing, we'll be asking Jesus the question his disciples first asked him in John's Gospel: "Rabbi, where are you staying?" (John 1:38).
